For example, Fiske & Company successfully rebutted a plaintiff's expert's multimillion-dollar lost revenues claim against a large gasoline station convenience store as a result of a gas leak in a tank manufactured by the defendant. "Our analysis of sales data proved the majority of lost revenues to be attributable to other causes, reducing the claim to under \$50,000," Fiske says.

In a nationwide class action lawsuit on overtime wage calculations, Fiske & Company used advanced data mining techniques to prove that the defendant's methodology resulted in an understatement of damages exceeding \$1 million. In another matter, Fiske used data from the defendant's database to secure a final judgment in excess of \$4 million for a plaintiff in a shareholder's business dispute.

A Certified Public Accountant (CPA), Fiske holds the Accreditation in Business Valuation (ABV) and Certification in Financial Forensics (CFF) from the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants, and is a member of the National Association of Certified Fraud Examiners. He has been retained on cases involving business damages and valuations, breach of contract disputes, divorces, eminent domain and many other issues.

He has appeared as an expert on valuation and patent infringement and intellectual property matters. He was a guest on CNN's "For Your Money" show on divorce issues, and has spoken on financial radio talk shows around the country.

Fiske also serves on the Board of Governors of The Hebrew University of Jerusalem and is chairman of the audit committee for the American Friends of Hebrew University and a national board member. He is also a board member for the Truman Institute for Peace.
